

Dear Keystone College Students and Families:

In the past several weeks, I have written to you several times to share our immediate plans in the midst of the global COVID-19 pandemic. The focus of those letters was on this public health crisis and keeping our Keystone community safe and informed as we continue our academic mission. I am writing to you now to share critical financial information that may be useful to you.

In response to the global COVID-19 Pandemic, the federal government has enacted the CARES Act to provide, among other things, financial support for students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19 (including eligible expenses for cost of attendance such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care).

The CARES act grants will be available in the amount of \$775 for every undergraduate student who completed the Spring 2019-2020 term with full-time enrollment in a traditional program. This grant is separate from other College financial aid awards and it benefits you. Keystone College will issue monies on **May 21, 2020** to students either by direct deposit or paper check, depending on the method selected by you. Signing up for direct deposit by May 19th is strongly encouraged, as applicable transactions will be processed shortly thereafter.
