

Dear Keystone College Students:

Recently, we e-mailed you a communication with detailed information regarding Keystone College's COVID-19 vaccination policy. We are aware that students have asked several important questions regarding the information we have provided. In an effort to provide additional clarity, here are answers to several frequently asked questions we have received, including the most current information on our policies and procedures.

- **What happens if I do not receive a vaccination by Oct. 29?**

Unvaccinated students who have **not** provided vaccination records or have **not** received an official College exemption:

- Will be placed into remote classes beginning November 1, 2021. Student-athletes who are moved to remote classes **cannot** participate in Athletics activities.
- Resident students will be moved to one location on campus.
- Will have limitations placed on participation in other campus activities.

- **Will I be dropped from my Fall 2021 classes if I do not receive a vaccination?**

No. Unvaccinated students will be dropped from Spring 2022 classes on **January 5, 2022** if they have not yet provided vaccination records or received an official College exemption by **January 4, 2022**.

- **Is there a vaccination exemption process?**

Students who have medical or religious reasons to be exempt from receiving the vaccination should apply for a medical or religious exemption with Carla Salsman (carla.salsman@keystone.edu) in the Counseling and Well-Being Center.

- **Are there incentives for students to become vaccinated?**

To reward students for completing the vaccination process and reporting their vaccination status to the College, we are offering a variety of incentives for students who have completed this important step, including chances to win a free room on campus or free parking for the year. Drawings for vaccinated students will be held throughout September and October.
